### THEMATIC COURSES

**Publics** 

These courses are aimed at all types of publics: international students, adults, technicians, researchers, au pairs...no matter their level in French.

### **Programmes contents**

The core curriculum covers four skills listed by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages - CEFR: oral comprehension, speaking, written comprehension and writing.

Emphasis is also given to phonetics and pronouncing (languages laboratory). French classes improve autonomy in the daily life and address societal issues.

### Training goals

- Learn French or improve oral and written skills;
- Validate a linguistic level with a university degree (DUEF) or an official diploma (DELF/DALF);
- Acquire the knowledge necessary to the comprehension of French civilisation, society and culture;
- Live an intercultural experience.

### **Teaching organisation**

Semi-annual and annual programmes: from Monday to Friday, in either morning or afternoon groups

Monthly and summer programmes: morning and/ or afternoon classes from Monday to Friday.

### **Tutoring**

In order to help you to progress, the semestrial and annual programme includes tutoring (up to 3 hours per semester, according to classes calendar), thanks to a personalized or in small groups follow-up.

What is tutoring? It is a formative, close support outside of class, with a teacher or a French student following a linguistic curriculum.

### **OPTIONAL COURSES AT THE UCLV**

### **LEVEL TEST**

A mandatory level test is set to evaluate written and oral skills in order to integrate students into homogeneous level groups<sup>2</sup>.

### **ASSESSMENT METHODS**

Attendance, ongoing evaluation and/or final exams on written and oral skills.

### **CERTIFICATION**

Our programmes lead to a language university degree certified by ADCUEFE (association of Universities offering courses in French for foreigners). At the end of the semester, a university degree in French studies (DUEF) stating the level attained by the student is awarded. A Certificate of French studies and culture is awarded for summer and intensive short programme.

### **EUROPEAN CREDITS - ECTS**

The training is expressed in European Credits. They will be considered by the student's home university.

### **OFFICIAL EXAMINATION CENTRE**

It is also possible to sit for the DELF, the DALF and the TCF exams while following a programme at the ILCF.

## WHY SHOULD YOU TAKE AN OFFICIAL FRENCH EXAM?

For more than 30 years, ILCF-Lyon has been an official examination centre for French language diplomas certified by FEI (France Éducation International) and by the French Ministry of National Education. More than 1000 candidates pass each year.

### **DELF and DALF Diplomas**

The DELF (Diploma in French Language Studies) and DALF (Diploma in Advanced French Language Studies) diplomas confirm international candidates' levels in French as a Foreign Language (FLE). These certifications can help you to study, work or migrate to a French speaking country.

### **TCF Test\***

The TCF (Test de connaissance du français) is a general test of French. It allows non-French speaking persons to evaluate and validate their knowledge in French, in a reliable and acknowledged way, thanks to simple and fast conditions.

### **Preparation for DELF and DALF exams**

Depending on the programme, ILCF offers a thematic preparation for exams for a total of 22 hours, on one semester, to get acquainted with these exams, to understand what is expected, to develop the necessary methodology, to practice with sample tests in order to sit for the exam in the best conditions and aim for an optimal outcome.




## **OUR CULTURAL ACTIVITIES**

The Catholic University of Lyon - UCLy, a private non-profit higher education institution, is located in the heart of Lyon. You will be able to benefit from all the services offered by the university, on all the campuses of UCLy.



### **Amenities**

All of our amenities (campuses, university residences,...) are secure: video monitoring, security guard, access control and accessible to persons with reduced mobility.



### Accomodation

UCLy helps its learners to find a place to live and offers several options (average prices per month, on 2023/2024 basis):

- UCLy Saint-Laurent student residences: from 458€ (excluding administration fees);
- UCLy Saint-Bernard student residences: from 530€ (excluding administration fees)
- private student residences from 550 € (administrative fees and electricity not included);
- independent apartments from 520 € (administrative fees not included);
- living with a French family (from 660€ per month (half board from Monday to Friday) or 700€ (half board from Monday to Friday+full board at weekends), administrative fees not included.

### Health, wellbeing and inclusiveness

The UCLy Health Service is composed of the Preventive Healthcare, the Counselling Service and the Disability Support Service. It assists UCLy students in different aspects of physical and mental conditions, and in their learning in order to facilitate their academic success.

Along their studies at the UCLy, they can consult a doctor and have an individual support. Throughout the year, preventing actions and events are led to inform and guide students.



### **University libraries**

Enroling at the ILCF offers access throughout the academic year to UCLy's university libraries located on Carnot and St Paul campuses, but offers access to every university library in Lyon as well.



### **Educational counselling**

A guidance counsellor is available to guide you to choose the proper French academic training.



### Internship in a firm

Students who wish do in an internship at a company\* to further their training can obtain an internship contract in compliance with the current legislation in force after meeting with the ILCF Director.

### **International Relations Office**

The UCLy International Relations Department is available to all students at the University and will assist you throughout your stay:

- ISD International Student Desk: Visa questions, looking for a job? From your arrival to the end of your stay, benefit from personalized support! (Assistance with administrative formalities in France: visa/stay permit, health insurance, housing assistance, APL/CAF, etc.).
- Pôle International: cultural activities for UCLy's international students & buddy program.



### **Sports Office**

A 400m<sup>2</sup> sports hall is available on the Saint Paul Campus. In addition, about 25 sport activities are offered throughout the academic year: collective (volleyball, soccer, rugby, etc.) and individual sports (swimming, taekwondo, badminton, dance and more).

## **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

### **Prerequisites**

- To be 18 year old or at least 17 with a written parental consent;
- To have a secondary school diploma with the exception of summer and short-term programmes;
- From beginner to C1 level (A1 level minimum for short intensive programme).

### **Pre-enrolment**

Step 1: Fill in the pre-enrolment application form

### Step 2: Pay the pre-enrolment deposit

In order to confirm your pre-enrolment, you need to pay a deposit which will be deducted from the total tuition fees:

- by bank transfer (see our bank details on the pre-enrolment form): send your receipt by email at ilcf@ univ-catholyon.fr
- by French check paid to "AFPICL"

### **Enrolment**

### Step 3: Provide the necessary documents

In order to finalize your enrolment, submit the documents requested below on our online registration platform https://inscriptions.ucly.fr/ and log in using the ID and password created during your preenrolment or submit directly to the ILCF secretariat:

- your high school or university diploma, translated into French (no translation needed for diplomas in English or Spanish)
- an ID photo
- If you have already sit for a French exam [DELF/DALF/TCF/DUEF], please send a copy of your certificate

### Step 4: Pay the enrolment balance and mandatory fees

All selected programmes <u>must be paid for in full</u> as follows:

- pay online on the ILCF website (using the login and password you used when you pre-registered online) before or within the first days of your arrival
- pay at the ILCF office:
  - by credit card (Visa, Visa Electron, Maestro, Mastercard, American Express, Union Pay, JCB etc.)
  - by French check in euros payable to "AFPICL"

We encourage students to use a credit card.

### Step 5 : Pay the CVEC

Students enroled for a semester or a year have to pay the «Contribution à la Vie Étudiante et de Campus - Contribution to Student life and Campus» (100€ - Fees 2023-2024) to the CROUS (Centre Regional des Œuvres Universitaires et Scolaires – Regional Centre for Scholar and University scholarships). The payment shall be done exclusively online via the following link: messervices.etudiant.gouv.fr The CVEC certificate must be sent to the ILCF secretariat.

### Deadline payment

The balance must be paid before or upon arrival and, at the latest, 15 days after the classes begin (for the semester and the academic year) and 5 days after for short and summer intensive programmes.

### Registration certificate

A certificate of enrolment is sent after receipt of the complete application and full payment of the tuition fees. For the semester and academic year sessions, a student card will be issued a few days after the start of the

### Additional administrative procedures

### **Student Visa**

As soon as we receive your application, the ILCF will send you the pre-enrolment certificate necessary to apply for your student Visa at the French Embassy in your country.

Our Institute is a member of the Campus France network. Don't hesitate to contact them for further information on visa applications.

No tourist visa can be converted into a «Student» visa or residence permit. No visa can be issued after your arrival in France.

### Mandatory health insurance

If you are a citizen of the European Union, you will need your European health insurance card issued in your country of origin.

If you are not a citizen of the European Union, you must register with the Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie [free registration] when you arrive in France, on the following website: https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr

As registration may take several weeks, we recommend that you take out personal and international medical insurance to cover the first 2-3 months of your stay in France.

To supplement the reimbursements provided by the Assurance Maladie, you can subscribe to a mutuelle.



For stays shorter than 90 days, we recommend you to subscribe to your own private health insurance.

### Visa/residence permit validation and renewal

2 to 3 months after your arrival in France, you must validate your visa on the website:

### **Cancellation policy**

### VISA REFUSAL


If the visa is denied by the country of origin and if the student provides us with the original of the official document confirming the refusal, the deposit will be reimbursed, except for 150 euros to cover administrative costs. The reimbursement will only take place if the ILCF administration is made aware of the situation by a written document at the latest 8 days before the level test. After that period, the totality of the payment will be kept by the ILCF.

### OTHER CASES

Pre-registered or registered students who decide to cancel or quit will not be refunded. The whole payment already settled will remain the property of the ILCF (see general terms and conditions available online www.ilcf.net)
