FRENCH AS A FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMMES



These courses are aimed at all types of international learners, adults, technicians, researchers, au pairs...no matter their level in French.

Programs contents

Training goals

The core curriculum covers four skills listed by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages – CEFR: oral comprehension, speaking, written comprehension and writing.

Emphasis is also put on phonetics and pronunciation (languages laboratory). French classes improve autonomy in the daily life and address societal issues.

- Learn French or improve oral and written skills;
- Validate a linguistic level with a university degree (DUEF) or an official diploma (DELF/DALF);
- Acquire the knowledge necessary to the comprehension of the French civilisation, society and culture;
- Live an intercultural experience.

Teaching organisation

Tutoring

Semi-annual and annual programs: from Monday to Friday, in either morning or afternoon groups

Monthly and summer programs: morning and/or afternoon classes from Monday to Friday.

In order to help you progress, the semestrial and annual program includes tutoring (up to 3 hours per semester, according to classes calendar), thanks to a personalized or in small groups follow-up.

What is tutoring? It is a formative, close support outside of class, with a teacher or a French student following a linguistic curriculum.

OPTIONAL COURSES AT THE UCLy

Learners, depending on their level, have the opportunity to take one or two courses in other UCLy training units. For more information, contact the ILCF secretariat at your arrival.

LEVEL TEST

A mandatory level test is set to evaluate written and oral skills in order to integrate students into homogeneous level groups².

ASSESSMENT METHODS

Attendance, ongoing evaluation and/or final exams on written and oral skills.

CERTIFICATION

Our programmes lead to a language university degree certified by ADCUEFE (association of Universities offering courses in French for foreigners). At the end of the semester, a university degree in French studies (DUEF) stating the level attained by the student is awarded. A Certificate of French studies and culture is awarded for summer and intensive short programme.

EUROPEAN CREDITS - ECTS

The training is expressed in European Credits. They will be considered by the student's home university.

OFFICIAL EXAMINATION CENTRE

It is also possible to sit for the DELF, the DALF and the TCF exams while following a programme at the ILCF.

WHY SHOULD YOU TAKE AN OFFICIAL FRENCH EXAM?

You are planning to enroll at a French university:

DELF B2 - DALF C1 - TCF

For more than 35 years, ILCF has been an official examination center for French language diplomas certified by FEI (France Éducation International) and by the French Ministry of National Education. More than 1000 candidates pass each year.

DELF and DALF Diplomas

The DELF (Diploma in French Language Studies) and DALF (Diploma in Advanced French Language Studies) diplomas confirm international candidates' levels in French as a Foreign Language (FLE). These certifications can help you study in, work in or migrate to a French speaking country.

TCF Test*

The TCF (Test de connaissance du français) is a general test of French. It allows non-French speaking persons to evaluate and validate their knowledge in French, in a reliable and acknowledged way, thanks to simple and fast conditions.

Preparation for DELF and DALF exams

Depending on the program, ILCF offers a thematic preparation for exams for a total of 22 hours, during one semester, to get acquainted with these exams, to understand what is expected, to develop the necessary methodology, to practice with sample tests in order to sit for the exam in the best conditions and aim for an optimal outcome.



The campus and its events



Accomodation

UCLy helps its learners to find a place to live and offers several options (average prices per month, on 2024/2025 basis):

- UCLy Saint-Bernard student residences: from 560 € [excluding administration fees]
- **private student residences:** from 600 € (administrative fees and electricity not included)
- independent apartments: from 600 € (administrative fees not included);
- living with a French family: from 770 € per month half board from Monday to Friday+full board at weekends (administrative fees not included)

Health, wellbeing and inclusiveness

The UCLy Health Service is composed of the Preventive Healthcare, the Counselling Service and the Disability Support Service. It assists UCLy students in different aspects of physical and mental conditions, and in their learning in order to facilitate their academic success.

Along their studies at UCLy, they can consult a doctor and have an individual support. Throughout the year, preventing actions and events are led to inform and guide students.







University libraries

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

1

Prerequisites

- To be 18 year old or at least 17 with a written parental consent;
- To have a secondary school diploma with the exception of summer and short-term programmes;
- From beginner to C1 level (A1 level minimum for short intensive programme).

Step 2: Pay the pre-enrolment deposit

Enrolment

Step 1: Provide the necessary documents

In order to finalize your enrolment, submit the documents requested below on our online registration platform https://inscriptions.ucly.fr/ and log in using the ID and password created during your preenrolment or submit directly to the ILCF secretariat:

- photocopy of your passport
- photocopy of your high school or university diploma, translated into French (no translation needed for diplomas in English or Spanish)
- an ID photo
- If you have already sit for a French exam [DELF/DALF/TCF/DUEF], please send a copy of your certificate [front and back].

Step 2: Pay the enrolment balance and mandatory fees

All selected programmes <u>must be paid for in full</u> as follows:

- pay online on the ILCF website (using the login and password you used when you pre-registered online) before or within the first days of your arrival
- pay at the ILCF office:
 - by credit card (Visa, Visa Electron, Maestro, Mastercard, American Express, Union Pay, JCB etc.)
 - by French check in euros payable to "AFPICL"

We encourage students to use a credit card.

Step 3: Pay the CVEC

Students enroled for a semester or a year have to pay the «Contribution à la Vie Étudiante et de Campus – Contribution to Student life and Campus» [103 € - Fees 2024-2025] to the CROUS (Centre Regional des Œuvres Universitaires et Scolaires – Regional Centre for Scholar and University scholarships). The payment shall be done exclusively online via the following link: **messervices.etudiant.gouv.fr**

You must include the CVEC certificate in your online registration file or send it by e-mail to the ILCF secretariat.

Deadline payment

The balance must be paid before or upon arrival and, at the latest, 15 days after the classes begin for the semester and the academic year and 5 days after for short and summer intensive programmes.

Registration certificate

A certificate of enrolment is sent after receipt of the complete application and full payment of the tuition fees. For the semester and academic year sessions, a student card will be issued a few days after the start of the course.



Additional administrative procedures

Student Visa

As soon as we receive your application, the ILCF will send you the pre-enrolment certificate necessary to apply for your student Visa at the French Embassy in your country.

For learners who are not from States belonging to the European Economic Area, we invite you to consult the official site of visa deliverance to France (http://france-visas.gouv.fr) and check with the French embassy in your country if you need a visa to stay in France.

We recommend doing these procedures at least **3 months** before the start of the chosen program.

For a stay longer than 90 days

If you live in a country or territory that follows the «Études en France» procedure, it is mandatory that you send your application via the patform to ask for a long-stay student visa that lasts over 3 months (VLS-TS). Do not hesitate to consult (http://www.campusfrance.org/fr/) and to get more information from you country's Espace Campus France.

For a stay of maximum 90 days

For short stays upto 90 days and according to your nationality you must, depending on your situation, ask for a short-stay Schengen visa.

Mandatory health insurance

If you are a citizen of the European Union, you will need your European health insurance card issued in your country of origin.

If you are not a citizen of the European Union and for a stay longer than 90 days, you must register with the Caisse Primaire d'Assurance Maladie (free registration) when you arrive in France, on the following website: https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr

As registration may take several weeks, we recommend that you take a personal and international medical insurance to cover the first 2 to 3 months of your stay in France.

To supplement the reimbursements provided by the Assurance Maladie, you can subscribe to a mutuelle.



For stays shorter than 90 days, we recommend you to subscribe to your own private health insurance before yor arrival in France. For further information: www.ucly.fr

Visa/residence permit validation and renewal

At the latest 3 months after your arrival in France, you must validate your visa on the website:


VISA REFUSAL

If the visa is denied by the country of origin and if the student provides us with the original copy of the official document confirming the refusal, the deposit will be reimbursed, except for 160 euros to cover administrative costs. The reimbursement will only take place if the ILCF administration is made aware of the situation by a written document at the latest 8 days before the level test. After that period, the totality of the payment will be kept by the ILCF.

OTHER CASES

Pre-registered or registered students who decide to cancel or quit will not be refunded. The whole payment already settled will remain the property of the ILCF (see general terms and conditions available online www.ilcf.netg.

By plane

From the Lyon-Saint-Exupéry airport, take the Rhônexpress tram and exit at Vaulx-en- Velin - La Soie, then take Metro line A to Perrache station.
